- Get an estimated **start and completion date** (but expect some flexibility for delays).
- 12. Will you be working on other projects at the same time?
- If they're juggling too many jobs, your project could face **delays.**

- Having one project manager ensures smooth communication.
- 14. How do you handle delays or supply shortages?
- Ask about **contingency plans** for material shortages or bad weather.
- 15. Do you clean up the worksite daily?
- Some contractors **leave a mess**—ask if they handle cleanup properly.

- 20. What's your process for closing out a project?
- A good contractor should offer a **final walkthrough** and ensure everything meets expectations.
